UNIFORM LIST**

All pupils are expected to wear the appropriate school uniform every day, unless prior permission has been given for special fund raising events. It enhances the reputation of the school and creates a sense of good order and discipline. All staff at St. Catherine's have responsibility for maintaining the agreed school uniform. If a child is not wearing correct uniform they will be politely reminded by any member of staff about the school's expectations. If they continue to wear incorrect uniform the Welfare Officer will send a note home and/or the class teacher, or member of the school management team, will speak to their parents.

Parents are asked to make sure that all items of uniform are clearly labelled with their child's name. We cannot accept liability for lost clothes.

Boys:

- Optional navy blazer with embroidered crest (available from PMG Schoolwear Uxbridge)
- School tie (available from school/PMG Schoolwear Uxbridge)
- Grey school trousers or smart grey shorts in summer (Please note, trousers or shorts should not have combat pockets and shorts should be above the knee. Skinny fit trousers are not acceptable for school.)
- White school shirt – short or long sleeved
- Grey standard plain long sleeved V-neck woollen jumper (available with school logo from PMG Schoolwear Uxbridge)
- Grey socks
- Black shoes or, in summer sensible black or brown sandals with toes enclosed
- Black/ navy/ dark grey coat or anorak (navy waterproof fleece with logo available from PMG Schoolwear, Uxbridge)

Girls:

- Optional navy blazer with embroidered crest (available from PMG Schoolwear Uxbridge)
- School tie (available from school/PMG Schoolwear Uxbridge)
- Grey skirt, grey pinafore or smart grey school trousers (Please note: Skinny fit trousers and leggings are not acceptable for school)
- White long or short sleeved school shirt to be worn with school tie
- Grey standard plain woollen cardigan or V-neck woollen jumper (available with logo from PMG Schoolwear Uxbridge)
- Plain white or grey knee socks or plain white ankle length socks – no socks with large bows are allowed
- Navy, black or grey tights (winter only) – wool or opaque
- Flat sensible black shoes. In summer sensible plain flat sandals in navy, black or white, with toes and heels enclosed may be worn.
- Black/navy/dark grey coat or anorak (navy waterproof fleece with logo available from PMG Schoolwear Uxbridge)
- Summer dress (available from School)

EYFS Uniform

- Plain navy tracksuit bottoms and sweatshirt (optional available with school logo from PMG Schoolwear Uxbridge)
- Pale blue polo shirt (optional available with school logo from PMG Schoolwear Uxbridge)
- Navy shorts
- Sensible velcro fastening footwear (shoes or trainers) for outdoor play and climbing in plain black, navy or white

PE: This PE uniform list follows National Health and Safety guidelines (to be worn on allocated PE day by KS1 and 2)

- PE bag (crested drawstring bags available from PMG schoolwear Uxbridge)
- Pale blue polo shirt (optional available with school logo from PMG Schoolwear Uxbridge)
- Black laceless plimsolls for indoor PE
- Navy shorts
- Plain navy tracksuit bottoms and sweatshirt for winter (optional available with school logo from PMG Schoolwear Uxbridge)
- Trainers for outdoor PE
- No watches, jewellery, gloves or items of school uniform may be worn during outdoor PE lessons.

Jewellery, Make Up and Hair

- 1 small stud earring may be worn in each ear – no other jewellery is permitted (including religious medals or bracelets)
- KS2 children may wear watches
- False nails or nail varnish must not be worn
- Simple hair bands and accessories in school colours grey, navy, red and black
- Long hair must be tied back
- Excessively decorative hair braids should not be worn to school
- Extreme haircuts are not permitted e.g. number 1 haircuts or the cutting of symbols into the hair
- Hair colouring is not permitted. Hair extensions are not permitted
- Soft brimmed hats only to be worn-no baseball style caps with a hard brim

Laces, ties and buttons

Children should be taught to button shirts, knot their own ties and tie shoe laces. Children may use ties on elastic until they can knot their own tie. If they cannot tie their laces, shoes with buckles/velcro are advised. It is expected that KS2 children will be able to do both these tasks independently.
